## PREFACE

1. These latest drafts of 1 Dial. 6 and 1 Dial. 7 are closely
reviewed and corrected versions of the Intermediate text.
2. The fundamental concern remains that of providing a
text of the Dialogus which is as close as possible to Ockham's
lost original. See the Preface to the Intermediate text for
details. Some changes to note from the previous version:
I have now eliminated V* as such, but retained V and
added Ox (a major "Ancona text") where relevant.
For the Canon Law (both text and glosses) I am now
utilizing (instead of the 1879 Friedberg ed.) the 1582 set of the
<i>Corpus Iuris Canonici</i> , references to which are digitally available
from the UCLA Library.
The use of <b>bold</b> in the latest versions is with respect to
the letter identifiers of the main recovery manuscripts ( <b>Bb</b> , <b>Fi</b> ,
An, We), to the Trechsel text (Ly), and for those readings
where <u>very many</u> alternative manuscripts are also cited (e.g. as
in 1 Dial. 6.1, 1 Dial. 6.56, 1 Dial. 7.25 and elsewhere).

There is an additional sidum in the notes: ITD
There is an additional siglum in the notes: <u>LTR</u> =
indicating suspected "Late", "Later", or "Latest" textual
rehandlings by Ockham. The implication of such rehandlings
will be more fully discussed in the Introduction to the final
version of the critical text.
